The next round of ordering will be in January for the February to June segment. LOTS of volunteers are needed EACH HOT LUNCH DAY. The actual food is delivered at 11:30AM. The Kindergarteners will be delivered to first as they eat first and then play. This year only Student Emergency Forms are being collected. There will be no comfort kits. The focus is on getting the actual forms returned in case of an actual emergency. The school will be provided with sticker photos of each student from the photographers, and each student’s current picture will be added to the form Matt has a documented emergency plan and is working to incorporate the existing SD36 procedures.
<p>G) H) SPC Update</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> School Planning Council hasn’t met yet. This is a council that is mandated by the BC Ministry of Education which includes an administrator and three parents. A teacher rep is invited. The focus is on educational needs of the students, educational programs, and a school plan, which is currently all in a “state of flux”. Due to year one of the school being just up and rolling, and year two with teacher job action, they are looking forward to getting things underway this year.

The installers will be Habitat; due to the nature of the installation, they need to install- there won’t be community volunteers this time. • A parent asked why there were no swings. Answered by Joanne: There are district guidelines setting out that there needs to be a separate area for swings – they are deemed dangerous in with other playgrounds due to inattention of children running unintentionally in the path of swingers. Also, Joanne pointed out that a swing only holds one person at a time; whereas other pieces of equipment are able to accommodate more children playing at the same time. Our play space is limited, and they want to maximize the equipment for our growing population. • Kelly G. indicated that he is currently in conversations with the City of Surrey in regards to possibly installing Swings on the City property adjoining the school.
